Greater Boston / General Lander(Lynn) Joint Meeting - December 12, 2014

Minutes of the December 12, 2014 Joint meeting of The CWRT of GB and The Lander CWRT in the Lynn GAR Hall.

The Annual XMAS Co-Sponsored Meeting of The CWRT of Greater Boston and The Lander CWRT began at 7:30 p.m. in The Meeting Hall downstairs at The GAR Hall with The Lander XWRT President beginning with an asking of The Pledge of Allegiance. After this he went over some North shore news and some upcoming events. After this, he introduced CWRT of GB President David Smith who was the main speaker for the evening.

David's program for this evening was a quick view of Massachusetts in the Civil War and its contributions. David reminded everyone of how much Massachusetts did for The Anti-Slavery and Women's Suffrage Movements. He also reminded everyone that Mass. sent off `150,000 young men, women and children in the military action to Preserve this Union, 15,000 of whom never returned and are shown as casualties.

David then spent the balance of his program reminding the audience that many of these were actual children of ages between 8 and 16 who were listed as Drummer Boys or Drummer Girls or Regimental Daughters or Color Bearers. David also reminded everyone that there were about 25 recipients of The Medal of Honor in this category of youngsters for what they did.

David then also read the many letters of these youngsters to their parents and went through the specific donations that each one made with their units. One of these was 12 year old Willie Johnson from Vermont whose Medal of Honor, Drum and other accessories were once placed in Room 27 of our Mass. State house and a connection to The Chelsea Soldiers Home. He is buried in Colorado.

After this short program, everyone was invited to the "eating" session of the night from all of the food that people brought in for the Celebration.

Patrick has ordered that the United States flag and the Commonwealth flag be lowered to half-staff at all state buildings from sunrise until sunset on Friday, December 19, 2014 in honor of PFC Keely R. Walsh, 18, Massachusetts Army National Guard, of Lancaster, who died on December 14, 2014.

Please be advised that Governor Deval L. Patrick has ordered that the United States flag and the Commonwealth flag be lowered to half-staff at all state buildings from sunrise until sunset on Saturday, November 8, 2014, in honor of Petty Officer 1st Class Richard Charles Tucker II, 38, U.S. Navy, of South Easton, who died on October 26, 2014

Please be advised that Governor Deval L. Patrick has ordered that the United States flag and the Commonwealth flag remain lowered to half-staff at the State House and at all state buildings in the City of Boston until sunset on Monday, November 3, 2014 in honor of Mayor Thomas M. Menino, who passed away on Thursday, October 30, 2014.

Please be advised that Governor Deval L. Patrick has ordered that the United States flag and the Commonwealth flag be lowered to half-staff at all state buildings from sunrise until sunset on Wednesday, October 22, 2014, in honor of SPC 4 Nicholas A. Flags to be retired can be from government entities, businesses, or residences.

Flags can be dropped off at the Massport Fire Station on Harborside Drive at Logan Airport or at the security desk in the Logan Office Center, also on Harborside Drive.

Flags can also be mailed to the Security Office, One Harborside Drive, Suite 200 S, Boston, MA 02128.
